



ANNUAL REPORT OF THE TREASURERS OF FREEBAR

We hereby deliver the following report of the Treasurers of FreeBar in respect of the 12-month period ended on 30 June 2022.

Income

During the period, FreeBar received a £1,500 donation from the Chancery Bar Association and a £1,500 donation from COMBAR. Those donations were made specifically to fund FreeBar's Visibility Project.

This income was paid into a FreeBar bank account with Barclays Bank. The Treasurers control the account.

Expenditure

FreeBar had no expenditure in the 12-month period ending 30 June 2022.¹ However, in July 2022 FreeBar made two significant payments in respect of the Visibility Project:

- £1,850 to the photographer, Christopher Andreou.
- £1,462.50 to the printers.

Notes

Although the income and expenditure in respect of the Visibility Project formally fall in two different accounting periods for FreeBar, it is appropriate to consider them together. As is apparent from the information above, the total expenditure by FreeBar on the project was £3,312.50. That was covered by £3,000 of donations from the Chancery Bar Association and COMBAR, and £312.50 of FreeBar's existing funds.

Balance

FreeBar's balance as at 30 June 2022 was £4,503.20. However, following the expenditure in respect of the Visibility Project in July 2022, the remaining cash balance available to FreeBar as at 31 July 2022 was £1,190.70.

¹ As noted in the report for the period ending 30 June 2021, FreeBar reimbursed Joyce Arnold on 19 January 2022 for a purchase made by her personally on behalf of FreeBar in 2020 (£60 of Gay's The Word gift vouchers to use as prizes for an online quiz forming part of FreeBar's 2020 online Pride celebration). That cost was reflected in the report for the period ending 30 June 2021, and so is not included in this report.
